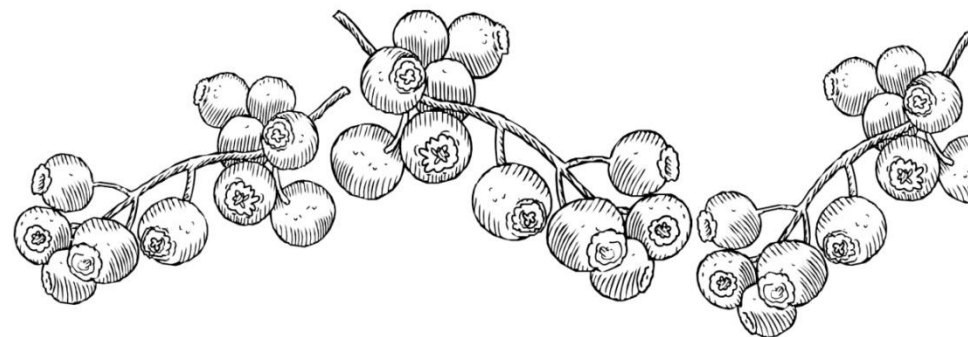

Rosie began her musical career at Holy Trinity Church Choir, Broadstairs, at the age of nine. Since then, she has gone on to study music at the University of Bristol, graduating with first class honours in 2018. Rosie has sung with many choirs, most notably the BBC National Chorus of Wales, with whom she performed in the BBC Proms on multiple occasions. Rosie also sang with St Mary's Church choir for multiple years, and is very pleased to be able to sing at Thornbury again today!

Rosie now lives in Canterbury and works at the Marlowe Theatre in Canterbury.

Malcolm has been involved in church music since he joined the choir of Holy Trinity Church, Folkestone in 2005, aged 10. Upon reaching Grade 5 piano in 2009, he started to learn the organ and was offered the organ scholarship at Holy Trinity. He studied under David Flood at Canterbury Cathedral, where he later became deputy lay clerk. At the same time, he began playing for regular services at his local village church in Goodnestone, near Canterbury.

In 2013, Malcolm began his Chemistry degree at Oriel College, Oxford, where he was a choral scholar. More recently, he has been a regular accompanist for Kent based ensemble, Caritas Chamber Choir including for evensongs in Canterbury Cathedral, and trips to Bath Abbey and Lille Cathedral.

Malcolm was Director of Music here at St Mary's from September 2017 - Christmas 2021 while studying for a PhD in Aerosol Chemistry at the University of Bristol, and now works in Pharmaceutical product development in Kent, alongside organist posts at two local churches.

Rosie and Malcolm were married in July in Kent, and are very much looking forward to giving this recital on their return to Thornbury today.
